

Clinician Scientist Program

The Department of Pediatrics at the University of Saskatchewan recently hosted a mini-symposium for trainees of the Canadian Child Health Clinician Scientist Program: "Mingling Minds Molecules and Machines: Participating Effectively in Collaborative Pediatric Research".

The program included a tour of the Canadian Light Source (the national synchrotron facility) and the Vaccine and Infectious Diseases Organization on the University of Saskatchewan campus. As well a session on First Nations perspectives on child health research was held at the Wanuskewin Heritage Park.

The symposium provided trainees with hands-on interactive experience that will help them to appreciate the opportunities, importance, and potential challenges of participating as a collaborator and leader in interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary child health research. This symposium provided an opportunity for trainees to consider how their own current research interests could benefit from multidisciplinary collaborations.
